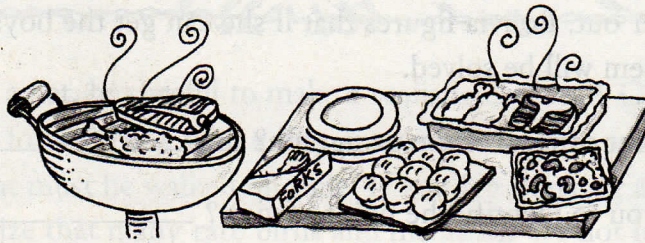


Skill Reminder A sentence expresses a complete thought.
